



#### Lifetime Professionalism Award Nominations Due November 4

TBA established its annual Lifetime Professionalism <a href="Award">Award</a> in 2015 to honor lawyers, judges or law professors who for a period of at least 25 years have demonstrated professionalism and dedication to the legal profession and legal community through civil, community, or legal service. Last year's honoree was Second Judicial Circuit Judge Charles A. Francis. Nominees must be <a href="members">members</a> of the Tallahassee Bar Association; one recipient is selected annually. Nomination forms are <a href="members">online</a>. The 2016 award will be presented at the TBA holiday party in December.



Florida Supreme Court Justice <u>James E.C. Perry</u> has announced his retirement. "After over sixteen years of proudly serving the citizens of the State of Florida, first as a circuit judge and currently as a Justice of the Florida Supreme Court, I am constitutionally mandated to retire by the end of my current term," Perry wrote in a letter to Gov. Rick Scott.

Gov. Jeb Bush appointed Perry a trial judge in the state's 18th judicial circuit, which includes Seminole and Brevard counties, in March 2000. Gov. Charlie Crist appointed Perry to the state's high court in March 2009. Florida's 85th justice, Perry is the fourth African-American to serve on the Florida Supreme Court.
